Open Days

In the summer we open our doors for our annual Family Fun Day. These events are a great opportunity for people from the neighbourhood to get together with games for all ages and abilities, play areas, competitions, music and refreshments.

Sunday

Morning Service

Starting at 10:45am the first part of the meeting is always geared towards the children before they leave the main hall to go to either Sunday School or Crèche. The service then continues and we sing, pray and listen to preaching from the Bible. The meeting usually ends around 12 noon.

In Sunday School the children meet together for a short time to sing and then split into separate classes according to ages. The children think about the message for the week through various activities.

We have excellent crèche facilities including a live feed of the service from the main hall and people available to look after your baby or toddler if you wish to leave them and return to the service.

Evening Service

Starting at 6:30pm this is usually a quieter meeting. We will again sing, pray and listen to preaching from the Bible; we then take time at the end of our service to observe the Lord's Table (Communion). If you are not yet a Christian please still come to the service as you only need to pass on the elements of bread and wine (juice) without taking them.

On the third Sunday in the month the Lord's Table follows the morning service instead of the evening service.

Spotlight English Club*

Starts in September 2018

For anyone in the community who wants to practise their spoken English

Spotlight programmes are made for people who are learning English. They are easier to understand and they help people develop their English.

The audio and video programmes use a method called 'Specialised English' - which uses fewer words spoken, shorter sentences all at a slower speed which is about half the normal speaking speed.

During our time together we listen to a 15 minute recording then chat and talk about what we have heard.

The Club is intended to be a safe & friendly environment with no classroom pressure. Everything is provided **FREE OF CHARGE** including the refreshments.

A youth club for local children aged 9-14 years

We provide many games and craft activities for the children to join in and the evening always ends with a short talk or story from the Bible.
