

Study 2 2 Thessalonians 1:6-12

1. Paul proclaims that “God is just.” How does he describe God’s justice? (V6-10)
2. How do you think suffering people, like the Thessalonians, would have responded to this teaching about God’s justice?
3. How can God’s justice encourage you when things are “just not fair”?
4. According to this passage, what makes a person “worthy of the kingdom” (v5) or “worthy of God’s calling (v11)?
5. What will cause God to punish some people when He returns (v8-10)?
6. In light of his teaching about God’s judgement, why does Paul pray as he does in verses 11-12?
7. If someone were to pray this prayer for you, what is one specific way in which you would want God to change your life?
